Still, despite all the benefits, migration also often comes with challenges and difficulties – to both the migrants and the receiving countries. According to the report published by Eurostat of the European Commission (2021), international migrants tend to have lower overall outcomes in areas such as labor market, education, or social inclusion – they are at higher risk of unemployment or poverty than national citizens.

Moreover, they face challenges such as:

- Language Barriers
- Lack of Employment Opportunities
- Housing
- Access to local services, including health care services
- Cultural Differences
- Prejudice
- Isolation

For the host societies, the fear is that migration and unsuccessful integration can lead to creation of segregated communities, which could increase radicalism and conflict.

To prevent and minimize the impact of such challenges, it is important that both the receiving countries and the migrants engage in the process of integration.
